

Operations Committee Report

Also present were Ed Gentile from engineering, and Anthony Strazza from Building permits.

1. 026.022 PROPOSED ORDINANCE; for publication: amending Ordinance No. 988, Street Opening Permit Fees to set a new fee structure.

Public hearing held at 7:00 pm, nobody from the public was present. Committee approved of finale adoption; 7-0-0

2. 026.023 REVIEW; of issuance and monitoring of building permits.

Report made; no action taken.

3. 026.024 RESOLUTION; approving an amendment to an agreement with Purcell Associates for consulting engineering services for the reconstruction of North Street.

The proposal of the reconstruction of North Street consisted on improving the street, sidewalks, sewers, replant and plant trees, and also to add lighting on the cemetery on Franklin Street. And finally to widen the street itself.

The total project will be founded by the state a 100 percent.

The city will also have to pay for test bits done to the street to see what is down under the street (ex. Utility pipes etc...). The cost would not exceed 25,000 dollars.

Committee voted to approve 6-0-1

4. 026.025 RESOLUTION; approving a contract with Fitzgerald & Halliday, Inc, for a multi-modal service study at the Transportation Center.

The Federal Government asked for a better service study at the Transportation Center, so the center can improve the in and out of buses, taxies, etc...

The total cost of the study will be 150,000 dollars. The Federal government will pay for 80 percent and the city will pay 20 percent.

Committee voted to approve 7-0-0
