Attorney Sullivan stated that this case was bifurcated. The first part was petition validation and second part is the substance. The petition part of this case went to the Supreme Court and is now settled law. This litigation is now to the substance and if the Board of Representatives appropriately overturned the Zoning Boards decision to amend the regulations to include the definition of gymnasium. This second part of the case standard procedure would be for the Board to file a brief and the other side to file a brief and argue before the courts. An opportunity was given to resolve the case short of moving forward with litigation.
