Operational Highlights

- All 200 traffic signals and the computerized traffic signal system are functional with minimal disruptions with the assistance of 70 traffic monitoring cameras, and 60 video detection devices.
- Improved traffic operations with adjusted signal timings.
- Improved pedestrian and vehicular safety with traffic signal adjustments and/or geometric improvements and/or pavement markings.
- Implementation of Traffic Calming Devices to minimized cut-thru traffic in residential neighborhoods.

Operational Highlights Continued...

- Commenced property demolition to make way for Urban Transitway Phase 2 project.
- Hope Street Improvement Project will be completed in the fall of 2014.
- Oaklawn Avenue Improvements project design completion by the spring of 2015.
- Atlantic Street railroad Bridge replacement design completion by the fall of 2014.
- Greenwich Avenue @ Pulaski Street improvements project design completion by the fall of 2014.

Financial Highlights

- Traffic Signal Communication and Control
 Hardware Upgrade project 80% project costs will
 be reimbursed with federal and/or state funds.
- Oaklawn Avenue Improvements project City's contribution toward the project is limited to 10% of all eligible project costs. 80% of Design, Right-of-way costs and Construction costs will be funded with Federal funds and 10% with State funds.

Cost Management

- Continue seeking Federal and State funds for capital projects.
- Continue administrating the use of Federal and State grants received.
- Obtain reimbursement of allowable project costs based on City State agreements from CTDOT in a timely manner.

Significant Requests for 2014-2015

- \$30,000 increases in Operating Equipment Maintenance line item to replace/repair aging and damaged traffic signal equipment.
- \$4.14M request in a new capital project Traffic Signal Communication and Control Hardware Upgrade to convert existing copper wire control to Fiber Option communication based operation. This project received \$3.3M federal/state grant funds.
