Total Cuts to the Operating Budget and Debt Service: \$300,000. (The Committee is waiting for the report from the actuary to determine the appropriate OPEB funding level)

## **WPCA Budget**

A motion to approve the \$111,613 in cuts to the WPCA Contribution to CERF from the WPCA Operating Budget proposed by the Board of Finance was made, seconded and approved 11-0-0. (Reps. Fountain, Cerasoli, Coleman, Day, DeLuca, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Figueroa, Kooris, Mitchell and Silver in favor).

## **Capital Budget**

A motion to approve the Capital Budget, in the amount of \$74,304,812 was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-1-0. (Reps. Fountain, Coleman, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Figueroa, Mitchell and Silver in favor; Rep. Cerasoli opposed.)

## **Police Extra Duty Fund**

A motion to approve the Police Extra Duty Budget, in the amount of \$9,246,000 was made, seconded and approved 10-0-0. (Reps. Fountain, Cerasoli, Coleman, Day, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Figueroa, Kooris, Mitchell and Silver in favor).

The Committee held the votes on the other budgets until Monday, May 4, 2015 at 6:00 p.m., pending receipt from the Actuary of the appropriate OPEB funding level
