Office of Public Safety Services Provided & Mission Statement





Public Safety Highlights

Stamford Police: Reduced total violent crime by more than 22% in 2018; Over 134,000 calls for service, 6,513 school based patrols, 51,471 programed patrols; 19,983 motor vehicle stops, 3,303 suspicious persons and issued more than 5,000 summonses. Multi Cultural and Religious Security Outreach; Body Worn Camera Program Review and Improvements; Community Policing and Community Services Model (Early Intervention and Prevention); Community Outreach Programs; Safest City in New England and Connecticut; Seized tens of thousands of dollars worth of narcotics and drug related assets; confiscated hundreds of guns and illegal weapons; Seized hundreds of pounds of unused prescription drugs during the drug prescription take back program; Numerous Safety and Security Initiatives;

- Stamford Health: Over 400,000 service contacts and interactions with the public last year (Inspections, Dental Hygiene, Nursing, Laboratory Services); Reorganization/Restructuring for Improvement of Services(Assistant Health Director/Supervisory Nursing Positions/APRN/etc); Health improvement initiatives; Improved Clinic Services, IAP, well child and flu vaccine program; Improved lead testing program in schools and municipal buildings; expanded bilingual outreach efforts.
- 911 Communications: Implementation of Text to 911; State Viper System Fully Functioning; Improved Emergency Medical Dispatching QA/QI; Improved First Responder Safety through AVL and GPS; Improved emergency response with closest unit to the address response; Answered over 160,000 Emergency 911 Dispatch Calls and nonemergency calls last year;
