#### RESOLUTION NO. 4135 ADOPTION OF THE CAPITAL BUDGET FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2022 TO JUNE 30, 2023

WHEREAS, the Board of Finance has transmitted to the Board of Representatives its recommended capital budget for the ensuing year, commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023 for final action by the Board of Representatives;

NOW THEREFORE BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE 31<sup>ST</sup> BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CITY OF STAMFORD that the itemized estimate of expenditures for the ensuing year 2022-2023 in the capital budget of the City as submitted by the Mayor, and as acted upon by the Board of Representatives in the amount of

#### \$55,508,272

is hereby approved and specific appropriations are hereby made for each of the various capital projects in the amounts appearing in the capital budget under the column heading "Adopted" recording the approval, or other action, of said Board of Representatives; and

# BE AND IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CITY OF STAMFORD AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** To meet the portion of the approved capital budget appropriations for public improvement and school projects (the "Projects") to be met from the issuance of bonds, \$34,420,000 general obligation bonds are authorized to be issued in one or more series, provided that the total amount of bonds to be issued shall be reduced by the Director of Administration to the amount necessary to meet the City's share of the cost of the Projects determined after considering the estimated amounts of any federal and state grants-in-aid thereof, or the actual amounts thereof if ascertainable. The bonds shall be general obligations of the City and each of the bonds shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the City are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon. The aggregate principal amount of bonds to be issued, and the manner of issue and sale shall be determined by the Board of Finance. The annual installments of principal, redemption provisions, if any, the certifying bank, registrar, transfer agent and paying agent, the date, time and other terms, details and particulars of such bonds shall be determined by the Mayor and Director of Administration. The bonds may be sold on a taxable basis upon a finding of the Board of Finance (which determination may be delegated to the Mayor and

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Director of Administration) that the issuance of such taxable bonds or other obligations is in the public interest. The bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest on the basis of the lowest net or true interest cost to the City, as determined by the Mayor and the Director of Administration.

The Mayor and Director of Administration are authorized, subject to Section 2. the approval of the Board of Finance, to make temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds. Notes evidencing such borrowings shall be designated "Bond Anticipation Notes", be signed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Controller, bear the City seal or a facsimile thereof, be certified by and payable at a bank or trust company designated by the Director of Administration, and be approved as to their legality by Pullman & Comley, LLC, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford and Bridgeport. They shall be issued with maturity dates which comply with the provisions of the City Charter and the Connecticut General Statutes governing the issuance of such notes, as the same may be amended from time to time. The notes shall be general obligations of the City and each of the notes shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the City are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing and marketing the notes, may be included as a cost of the Projects approved hereby, to the extent such interest is paid from the proceeds of such renewals or said bonds. Upon the sale of the bonds, the proceeds thereof, to the extent required, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of the principal of and the interest on any such notes then outstanding or shall be deposited with a bank or trust company in trust for such purpose.

Section 3. The City hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and any time after the date of passage of this resolution in the maximum amount of the Projects with the proceeds of bonds, notes, or other obligations ("Tax Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the City. The Tax Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Projects, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The City hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Director of Administration or such director's designee is authorized to pay Project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of the Tax Exempt Obligations.

**Section 4.** The Mayor, the Director of Administration and the Controller, or any two of them, are hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to enter into agreements or otherwise covenant for the benefit of bondholders to provide information on an annual or other periodic basis to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB") and to provide notices to the MSRB of certain events as enumerated in Securities and Exchange Commission Exchange Act Rule 15c2-12, as amended, as may be necessary,

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appropriate or desirable to effect the sale of the bonds and notes authorized by this resolution. Any agreements or representations to provide information to the MSRB made prior hereto are hereby confirmed, ratified and approved.

**Section 5.** The Mayor, the Director of Administration and the Controller, or any two of them, are hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to enter into any other agreements, instruments, documents and certificates, including tax and investment agreements, for the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this resolution. The Mayor, the Director of Administration and the Controller, or any two of them, are hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to apply for and accept any and all Federal and State loans and or grants-in-aid of any Project, to expend said funds in accordance with the terms hereof, and in connection therewith to contract in the name of the City with engineers, contractors and others.

At a Special Meeting of the 31<sup>st</sup> Board of Representatives held on Tuesday, May 3, 2022, the above budget was acted upon and approved. This resolution was approved by unanimous voice vote.
