Project Spotlight, Connecticut Tech Hub



The Stamford Partnership is a convener of the Southwest CT Tech Partnership, which brings together tech- and data-driven leaders to strengthen our region's position as a thriving Tech Hub. Project Spotlight, Co-Working

The Partnership's free co-working program has been growing rapidly and is expected to continue its steady growth in 2024. Last year the Partnership increased the cadence of its co-working sessions to weekly (versus roughly biweekly the previous year) and added compelling programming including resumebuilding and access-to-finance workshops.
