WHEREAS, pursuant to **C.G.S Section 32-763**, the Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development is authorized to extend financial assistance for developing a comprehensive plan for the remediation and redevelopment of multiple brownfields (called the **Brownfield Area-Wide Revitalization (BAR) Planning Grant**); and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the public interest that the City of Stamford make an application to the State for \$200,000 in order to undertake the Greenwich Avenue/Davenport Street Corridor Improvement Plan and to execute an Assistance Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES:

1. That it is cognizant of the conditions and prerequisites (including the match obligations) for the state financial assistance imposed by **C.G.S Section 32-763 and the Guidelines of the BAR Planning Program**;
2. That the filing of an application for State financial assistance by the City of Stamford in the amount of \$200,000 is hereby approved and that **David R. Martin, Mayor** is directed to execute and file such application with the Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development, to provide such additional information, to execute such other documents as may be required, to execute an Assistance Agreement with the State of Connecticut for State financial assistance if such an agreement is offered, to execute any amendments, decisions, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the City of Stamford.
3. That it agrees to fulfill the required 10% cash match of the BAR Planning Grant Program if the application is successful.
