Moira Sawch provided an overview of the CDBG proposals, highlighting the grant amount of \$989,095 and the allocation limits for public service and public improvement projects.

 Allocation Limits: Moira explained the allocation limits, specifying that \$148,364 is allocated for public service projects and \$643,000 for public improvement projects, with the remaining funds covering administrative costs.
