This letter is to request that you place on your next agenda a request for the demolition of the existing Police Headquarters located at 805 Bedford Street under Section 9-10 of the Code of Ordinances which reads:

Sec. 9-10. Procedure for demolition of City-owned real property

- A. If the Boards have all recommended that a particular city-owned building or structure which has an assessed value of the Grand List of the City of Stamford be demolished, the Mayor may order the demolition of such property by directing the Director of Operations to apply for a demolition permit pursuant to Chapter 88 of the Code of Ordinances.
- В. If all the Boards have not recommended the demolition of a particular city-owned building or structure, the Mayor shall request approval of the demolition from the Planning Board, the Board of Finance and the Board of Representatives. When all three (3) boards have approved the demolition of the unused property, the Mayor shall order the demolition as described above.

As per the City Engineer, this structure is not cost effective to renovate for re-use. I attach Mr. Casolo's letter.

Please be advised that after evaluating the re-use of the existing Police Headquarters constructed in 1955 at 805 Bedford Street, it was determined that the building is not feasible for renovations for many reasons:

- A new headquarters is being built on the adjacent site.
- Not cost effective to renovate as new due to the presence of hazardous materials; which requires the demolition of a significant portion of the building for its proper removal.
- Not a historic property.

In connection with the development of the abutting property as the new Police Headquarters, Engineering recommends the demolition of the building.

Section 9-10 of the City Code requires the approval of the demolition of any City building be approved by the Planning Board, the Board of Finance and the Board of Representatives, upon the request of the Mayor. Therefore, please request that the three boards approve the demolition of the existing Police Headquarters located at 805 Bedford Street.
