




Readings were taken at all the establishments listed above, again assuring adherence to proper procedures. Readings were also taken at the apartment buildings.

Due to the clustering of bars and restaurants located at Bedford Street and Summer Street I was unable to validate this complaint based on the Stamford, Connecticut-Code of Ordinance Sec. 164-5. Noise levels. The readings were taken from the Bruel & Kjaer machine. A total of 18 readings were taken on the machine. The report has been attached for review.

DJ music is being utilized also. Noise reading is taken. Michael, the manager is showing me that the outside speaker had been turned off also. They admit people who are 23 years and over only. He pointed out that they also own Town Parlor which is just across them.

Town Parlor-112 Bedford Street

DJ music. Noise reading is taken. Justin, the manager was there to meet us when we arrived. They admit people who are 21 years and older. There was a short line of people waiting to go in.

Hudson Social-128 Bedford Street

This is not in our list but there was such a long line of people waiting to be admitted. DJ music. Noise reading is taken.

Club London/Tawas-489 Glenbrook Road

This was visited last night but because of the egress issue, we went to do an unannounced visit to check and DFM Brennan was satisfied with their compliance. Manager Filipo Caro was there.

Managers and staff are courteous and want to cooperate on how things can be alleviated.

Sign of the Whale - 6 Harbor Point Road

No dj music playing at the roof top patio dining but speaker has some music being transmitted but not loud. Reading taken.

30 Elmcroft Road

No music can be heard. Reading taken. This was added on to today's list from email sent to Mr. Jankowski on July 16 regarding the live band music that echoes from Beer Garden across the water from Sue Halpern.

Beer Garden - 290 Harbor Drive

Live band was playing and because of thunderstorm, they moved them into the garage section today since they started playing. They usually would be by the grass area nearer the water section on other times. The bands play on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. It used to be 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. and it is now 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Reading taken.

T's - 523 Pacific Street

No music is being played and owner says that he had shut down the patio dining now for the evenings. He only serves brunch there on Sundays. He feels that the City is harassing him. He says that he, his expediter and lawyer are waiting to hear from the mayor, Mr. Pollard and Mr. Madden.

Brickhouse - 244 Bedford Street

No DJ at the time of visit. Outside speaker has piped in music being played. The outside speaker is turned off at 10 or 11 p.m. Reading taken.

Chakos - 78 W Park Place

Outside music has piped in music. They turn off the outside speaker at 9 p.m. No DJ or singerat the time of visit. Reading taken.

Riviera Maya – 20 Summer Street

DJ music was being played when we arrived but we do see set-up for live music. Manager says that live music occurs around twice a month. Reading taken.

Jerky's ~ 227 Summer Street

DJ music being played. Door was opened. No outside speaker. Live music is on Sundays. Reading taken.

1011 Washington Blvd. – Vela building

No road construction occurring tonight.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH - NOISE TASK FORCE REPORT OF 7/23/2021

July 23, 2021 - The Joint Task Force included-

Health Inspector Norma Jarrett; Stamford Police Officers - Eric Cooper and Kevin Becroft, Deputy Fire Marshal Robert Martino, State of CT Department of Consumer Protection – Liquor Control Division Personnel - Special Agent William Boucher, Liquor Control Agents - Kyle Anderson and Michael Kula conducted a joint inspection to investigate various complaints regarding noise, overcrowding, and other public safety issues.

Below are findings:-

T' Kitchen 523 Pacific Street -

There was no band nor amplified music at this facility at the time of inspection. Based on citizen's complaints regarding underage drinking and other concerns, an inspection was conducted. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Reyes – 99 Stillwater Ave.

There was amplified music that exceeded levels set by City's Noise Ordinances. The owner was cooperative and lowered the amplified music. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Sign of the Whale – 6 Harbor Point Rd.

Restaurant converted to a nightclub atmosphere numerous patrons in attendance; amplified music exceeded the maximum noise ordinance level as set forth in the City's Noise Ordinance. Manager was cooperative and turned down the music. Floors throughout the entire lower level were slippery and heavily saturated with liquid. The floors were also littered with disposable cups as well as shards from colored glass bottles. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Hudson Social - 128 Bedford Street

Readings taken at the location exceeded the levels set in the City's Noise Ordinances. There was a long line of patrons waiting to enter the "club - like" establishment. The facility was readily identified to be emitter of the loud amplified music from the open door, and the outdoor amplified speaker. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Towne Parlor Pizza – 112 Bedford Street

Readings taken at the location exceeded the levels set in the City's Noise Ordinances. There was a long line of patrons waiting to enter the "club - like" establishment; manager immediately lowered the amplified noise. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Capriccio Café – 189 Bedford Street

This facility was closed upon arrival. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Bradford's Grill & Tayern - 83 Bedford Street

Readings taken at the location exceeded the levels set forth in the City's Noise Ordinances. The manager was responsive, and immediately turned down the amplified music. There was a patron whom the bouncer recognized was in distress, and the manager summoned for assistance. The Police Officers and Special Agent as well as the Deputy Fire Marshal responded. The EMS responded to the incident and the patron was transported to the Stamford ER. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

Tigin Irish Pub - 175 Bedford Street

Readings taken at the location exceeded the levels set forth in the City's Noise Ordinances. The manager was responsive, and immediately turned down the amplified music.

It is important to note that majority of the establishments on Bedford Street (between Broad & Spring), the close proximity and the tunneled layout, makes it difficult to distinguish the exact emitter's reading; except for those with open doors coupled with the outdoor speakers with amplified music.

The Brick House – 244 Bedford Street

Readings taken at the location exceeded the levels set forth in the City's Noise Ordinances. Additionally there were several customers smoking in the front foodservice area. Liquor Control Division & Fire will furnish their reports.

There is pervasive use of outdoor speakers transmitting garish, amplified music from establishments on Bedford Street.

Other observation is that of the heavy traffic flow and loud music from motor vehicles and bikes in said vicinity. There was one driver that made a right turn from Spring Street onto Bedford Street; this was corrected in a timely manner to prevent any major catastrophe.

On July 23, 2021, at approximately 11:15 PM, a joint taskforce investigation was conducted at Brick House Bar Restaurant, which is an establishment operating under City of Stamford Department of Health Foodservice License # FL-20-12. The investigation was conducted after an excessive noise complaint was filed with Stamford Department of Health. Present for the investigation were Norma Jarrett, Health Inspector II, Deputy Fire Marshal, Robert Martino; Stamford Police Officers - Eric Cooper and Kevin Becroft; and State of CT Department of Consumer Protection – Liquor Control Division Personnel - Special Agent William Boucher, Liquor Control Agents - Kyle Anderson and Michael Kula.

The investigation revealed the following findings: Your foodservice establishment was in violation of the City of Stamford Code of Ordinances Section§164-5A. It shall be unlawful for any person to emit or cause to be emitted any noise beyond the boundaries of his/her premises in excess of the noise levels established in these regulations.

The amplified music emitted from your commercial foodservice establishment, at the time of our investigation and measured by the Bruel & Kjaer Noise Meter, registered the lowest reading of 70.2dB and ranged to a high of 88.2 dB. This amplified noise presents a nuisance for residents in the multifamily dwellings above your establishment and beyond.

These readings far exceeded the 45dBA maximum night time level, set forth in Section§164-5B(2) No person in a commercial zone shall emit noise beyond the boundary of his/her premises exceeding the levels stated herein and applicable to adjacent residential, commercial or industrial zones.

At the time of inspection, the Health Inspector also observed patrons smoking in the front dining area of your establishment. In Violation Public Act 09-232 - Sec. 19a-342(b).

(b) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 31-40q, no person shall smoke: (A) In any building or portion of a building, partially enclosed shelter on a rail platform or bus shelter owned and operated or leased and operated by the state or any political subdivision thereof; (B) in any area of a health care institution; (C) in any area of a retail food store; (D) in any restaurant; (E) in any area of an establishment with a permit issued for the sale of alcoholic liquor pursuant to section 30-20a, 30-21, 30-21b, 30-22, 30-22c, 30-28, 30-28a, 30-33a, 30-33b, 30-35a, 30-37a, 30-37e or 30-37f, in any area of an establishment with a permit for the sale of alcoholic liquor pursuant to section 30-23 issued after May 1, 2003, and, on and after April 1, 2004, in any area of an establishment with a permit issued for the sale of alcoholic liquor pursuant to section 30-22a or 30-26.

Per Sections §19a-206 of the Connecticut General Statutes and the authority of the Director of Health of the City of Stamford, you are hereby given this **WARNING** to immediately abate this noise nuisance emitted from your foodservice establishment, as well as illegal smoking activities in your establishment.

You are hereby directed to ensure that the amplified music (noise nuisance) in this establishment does not exceed that set forth in the City of Stamford Code of Ordinance, Section 164-5B(2) for night time hours beyond the boundary of this establishment. You are further directed to ensure that all noise emitted during daytime and nighttime hours from this establishment, as well as the illegal smoking, do not constitute a nuisance that will jeopardize the health or welfare of your Stamford neighbors or degrade their quality of life.

Your failure to comply with this directive will result in further enforcement actions, including actions by other state and local code officials.
