## SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE REGARDING LIABILITY OF THE CITY OF STAMFORD FOR ICE AND SNOW ON PUBLIC SIDEWALKS

This ordinance amends Chapter 214, Article II, of the Code of Ordinances, Streets and Sidewalks, Encroachments and Excavations, to adopt the provisions of Connecticut General Statutes §7-163a, as amended from time to time, regarding the liability of the City of Stamford to any person injured on a public sidewalk due to ice or snow. The ordinance clarifies that the City will only be liable for injuries due to the presence of ice or snow on a public sidewalk if the City is the owner or in control of the land abutting the sidewalk, or if the City takes affirmative acts with respect to the sidewalk. In all other cases the owner or person in possession and control of the land abutting a public sidewalk may be liable for such injuries.

This ordinance takes effect upon approval.
