Subject: Two Small Recommended Changes

Jonathan – Just reviewed with Tekni-Plex. Two quick thoughts:

Suggestion #1: Allow for raw meat to remain excluded.

We completely get not including prepared foods in polystyrene but the packaging for things like ground beef and steaks is sanitary, prevents dripping, etc.

The fix would be to just delete the word “meat” from Section 3b. It would then read “No Food Packager shall package meat, eggs, bakery products or other food in or on polystyrene containers.”

Suggestion #2: Reword Section C prohibition to directly address restaurant take-out containers.

Section C’s wording is broad “No Retail Vendor in the City of Stamford who sells tangible personal property at retail shall sell PS food or beverage containers.” I think it means to say that empty containers can’t be sold at retail and would like to prevent any unintended consequences.

Could we clarify that by adding one word “No Retail Vendor in the City of Stamford who sells tangible personal property at retail shall sell empty polystyrene food or beverage containers”?
