The Legislative & Rules Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Heaphy, Vice Chair Coleman and Committee Member Reps. Day, Mitchell, Nabel, Okun, Ryan, Silver and Zelinsky. Also present were Reps. Fedeli and Franzetti; Thomas Madden, Director of Economic Development; Kathy Emmett, Corporation Counsel; Jim Lunney, Zoning Enforcement Officer; and Polly Rauh (see <u>public hearing sign-in sheet</u>).

Chair Heaphy called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

Chair Heaphy opened the public hearing. Ms. Rauh spoke in favor of the ordinance, noting that there is no additional cost to the City and that it will enable shelters and the Tully Center to remain open in the event of an emergency. There being no other members of the public wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed. Mr. Madden stated that expanding the boundaries of the EID will open up opportunities for Stamford, particularly for the shelter system. A motion to approve this ordinance for final adoption was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 8-0-1 (Reps. Heaphy, Day, Mitchell, Nabel, Okun, Ryan, Silver and Zelinsky in favor; Rep. Coleman abstaining).

Representative Coleman reviewed the attached <u>handout</u>. It was noted that the Code provides that OPEB members may attend electronically. Committee members discussed whether they should be counted toward a quorum or vote. The consensus of the Committee was that members who attend electronically should not be able to vote or be counted toward a quorum. Committee members then discussed whether board or commission members should be able to passively attend by telephone. Members noted that members can already watch the videos of meetings. The consensus of the Committee was that there be no change made to the current procedures which do not permit members to attend electronically, other than for OPEB. Chair Heaphy will draft a letter to the Mayor reflecting the views of the Committee.

Ms. Emmett distributed the attached <u>handout</u>, which regarding the current and settled litigation and included the information requested at the last meeting: the categories of the litigations, attorney names, and a list of property tax foreclosures. She noted that the current budget request for outside consultants, which included outside counsel, is \$600,000.00. The City is self-insured up to \$1 million per claim, with layered insurance after that of at least \$25 million.

Mr. Lunney explained the process by which restaurant owners apply for sidewalk café permits. The owner must pay a \$100 fee to apply for the permit and provide a survey of the space, which is reviewed by the police department, fire department and the health department before he signs off on the permit. He explained that if there will be a fee based upon square footage, he

will require updated surveys in order to ensure that the square footage is charged correctly. This will cost the restaurant owners a few hundred dollars. He noted that some restaurants apply for permits even though they do not have outdoor cafes in order to participate in outdoor festivals. This ordinance only applies to restaurants in the Downtown District. Committee members discussed whether this fee was appropriate, whether there should be a base fee and whether the square footage fee should be phased in. Committee members also discussed with Mr. Lunney how enforcement of illegal expansion onto a City sidewalk should be enforced. A motion to amend the fee to a \$200 application fee plus \$2 per square foot was made and seconded. A motion to amend that motion to reduce the application fee to \$100 was made. seconded and approved by a vote of 5-3-1 (Reps. Coleman, Day, Okun, Ryan and Silver in favor; Reps. Mitchell, Nabel and Zelinsky opposed, Rep. Heaphy abstaining.) A motion to amend the ordinance to phase in the square footage fee with the fee being \$1 per square foot the first year and \$2 per square foot thereafter was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 5-4-0 (Reps. Heaphy, Coleman, Day, Okun and Silver in favor; Reps. Mitchell, Nabel, Ryan and Zelinsky opposed.) A motion to approve the ordinance, as amended, was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 6-3-0 (Reps. Heaphy, Coleman, Day, Okun, Ryan and Silver in favor; Reps. Mitchell, Nabel and Zelinsky opposed.)

Committee members discussed the Charter provision giving the Board of Representatives the authority to set fees and whether this ordinance was an intrusion of the executive into the legislative process. Members also noted that this ordinance does not allow for a public hearing or give the Board of Representatives the ability to amend a proposed fee. A motion to approve this ordinance was made, seconded and failed by a vote of 1-6-1 (Rep. Zelinsky in favor; Reps. Coleman, Day, Mitchell, Nabel, Okun, Ryan and Silver opposed; Rep. Heaphy abstaining.)
