The Legislative & Rules Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Lee and Committee Member Reps. Fedeli, Jacobson, Lion, Miller, Nabel and Zelinsky. Absent were Committee Member Reps. Coleman and Florio. Also present were Rep. McMullen; Ralph Blessing, Land Use Bureau Chief, Dana Lee, Law Department; Mike Johnson, Sullivan & LaSane; and four members of the public: (See public hearing sign-in sheets for LR30.065 and LR30.088).

Chair Lee called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Chair Lee opened the public hearing. Mr. Hennessey distributed the <u>attached photograph</u> and spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance. Mr. Latosh asked for clarification regarding shielded lights, cut-off fixtures and flood lights on residential properties. There being no other members of the public present wishing to speak, Chair Lee closed the public hearing.

Committee members discussed the proposed ordinance with Mr. Blessing. Mr. Blessing explained that shielded lighting is a light fixture that doesn't allow light above a horizontal plane. He further explained that whether a light is in violation of the ordinance depends on a variety of factors – not only the brightness of the light, but its intensity at the residential property line, and the intensity in relation to distance.

Chair Lee noted that the public will have a year to understand this ordinance, and that there will need to be a public education campaign.

A motion to approve this ordinance for final adoption was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 7-0-0 (Reps. Lee, Fedeli, Jacobson, Lion, Miller, Nabel and Zelinsky in favor).

Chair Lee stated that he had communicated Committee members concerns of last month with President Quinones, who did not offer alternative language.

Committee members discussed whether this change is necessary. Deleting this sentence might not change that requirement because of Robert's Rules of Order does not permit a "no" vote on an election. Members in opposition can submit additional names to be considered. If the goal is to require majority approval of nominees, additional changes would need to be made to the language of the rules. President Quinones will again be invited to submit revised language to better accomplish the intended objective.

Mr. Johnson noted that there is currently a <u>bill before the General Assembly</u> regarding polystyrene. He anticipates that this bill will pass and will contain a provision to preempt local ordinances. There will be a public hearing on this bill next week.

Committee members discussed:

- Whether the Committee should proceed with publication if there is likely to be a State statute and the likelihood that a State statute will pass or will preempt local ordinances
- Replacing the language of the proposed ordinance with the Norwalk ordinance
- The need for an exemption or a longer lead time for the public schools, in order to fit
 with the schools' contract bidding; Dr. Lucero should be invited next month to address
 the time needed
- Including an exemption for raw meat as well as raw fish
- Having Norwalk's ordinance reviewed by Corporation Counsel
