The Legislative & Rules Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Berns, Vice-Chair Boeger and Committee Member Reps. Blank, Cottrell, Fedeli, Matheny, Sherwood, and Vandervoort. Also in attendance were Reps. Camporeale, de la Cruz, Goldberg, Ley, Mays, Morson, Stella, and Strain, Summerville; City Attorneys Dana Lee and Chris Dellaselva; Director of Operations Matt Quinones; Director of Economic Development Leah Kagan; Amber Schmidt, New England Zero Waste Specialist, Clean Water Action; Dr. Yaniv Chen, MD, Cindy Roberts, distributor for disposable food service supplies; Vincent Giordano, Sierra Club volunteer; and members of the public.

Chair Berns called the meeting to order at: 7:04 p.m.

Public hearing session opened at 7:45 pm and there were 14 members of the public who signed up to speak or raised their hand to speak. Due to technology or other reasons, 3 of these speakers could not be heard or left the meeting prior to their name being announced to speak. The majority of the speakers were in favor of the spirit of the proposed ordinance but pointed out various reasons why they felt the ordinance as currently drafted would cause economic hardship on business owners in the food service industry. Public hearing session closed at 8:30 pm.

Ms. Amber Schmidt of Clean Water, a non-profit organization who has attended and presented at prior committee meetings on this item, was again available to speak. She gave a short presentation and also assisted with answering questions regarding alternative single use food packaging to replace current plastic single use packaging. Ms. Cindy Roberts, a distributor & supplier regionally to businesses like Shop-Rite, also spoke regarding available alternatives to single use plastics for food & beverage containers. Attorney Lee spoke briefly, and answered questions from committee members; Dr. Sarah Evans, a medical doctor invited by Rep. Camporeale to speak to the committee about health impacts of single use plastic, was not available to come to the committee meeting but sent subsequent written testimony and her intended slide presentation to be added to the legislative file.

After much discussion and questions with the presenters, the committee decided to move to recommit this item to Steering to allow for more work to be done on refining the implementation timelines for it if it should pass.

A motion to recommit Item 1 to Steering was made, seconded, and approved by a vote of 8-0-0 (Chair Berns, Vice-Chair Boeger, Reps. Blank, Cottrell, Fedeli, Matheny, Sherwood, and Vandervoort in favor).
