Big 12 title game

The Big 12 will be allowed to hold a football championship game in the future if it wants to under a rule change approved at the NCAA's annual convention. The change scraps the requirement that leagues have 12 members and play in two divisions in order to hold a title game. The new rule lets a smaller league play a title game pitting its top two teams, provided it plays a round-robin regular season schedule as the Big 12 does now. The 10-member Big 12 is the only major conference that doesn't play a football title game. ... Clemson defensive end **Kevin Dodd** is entering the NFL draft, skipping his senior year. The 6-foot-5, 280-pound fourth-year junior got his first chance to start this season and finished with 23.5 tackles for loss this season to rank second in the FBS behind teammate **Shaq Lawson**, who is also entering the draft. Also, running back **Wayne Gallman** will return for his junior season. ... Admitting it found NCAA violations in its men's basketball program dating to 2011, Missouri banned itself from the postseason this year and said it was vacating all 23 wins from the 2013-14 season. ... An NCAA rule change will help basketball underclassmen get NBA evaluations without losing eligibility. Players can enter the draft multiple times and work out with 1 team per year. Players will have 10 days after the combine to withdraw and return to school.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE

Amending Chapter 214, Article II, Section 214-29 of the Code of Ordinances

This ordinance amends Chapter 214, Streets and Sidewalks, Article II, Encroachments and Excavations, Section 214-29, Excavation Permit Required to

1) amend the fees charged by the City for all permits issued under Section 214-29, based upon the street classification and square footage, as follows:

Street Classification	Amount of Fee	Plus Square Footage Fee
1. Local	\$250.00	\$1.00 per square foot
2. Collector	\$375.00	\$1.50 per square foot
3. Minor Arterial	\$625.00	\$2.50 per square foot
4. Major Arterial	\$875.00	\$3.50 per square foot

2) add an additional fee of \$100 per cut for cutting into sidewalks;

3) require a separate permit and separate fee for each portion of a roadway from one intersection to the next intersection upon which excavation is performed; and

4) limit the duration of any permit to a period of 14 calendar days and require an additional fee of 25% of the total fee paid for the initial 14 day period, for each ensuing 7 day period until construction activities have concluded; and

5) require completion of the final patch within 6 weeks after the date of the end of the Construction Period stated in the permit. Failure to complete final patch within such time period shall constitute an offense within the meaning of Subsection E of this Ordinance.
