ARTICLE II. - ENCROACHMENTS AND EXCAVATIONS

Sec. 214-14. - Obstructions prohibited; safe passage.

A.—No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any obstruction to public travel in any street or sidewalk, and no person shall close any street or sidewalk, for an entire block or any portion thereof, unless such person shall have obtained a permit for such obstruction granted as provided by an appropriate city ordinance Section 214-19.

B. In the case of obstruction of a sidewalk, Aany person granted such a permit under an appropriate ordinance shall Section 214-19, when possible, provide at all times a safe and convenient passage over or around such obstruction.

Sec. 214-19. - Permit for placing building materials <u>and/or construction equipment</u> on streets <u>and sidewalks; permits for street and sidewalk obstructions and closures</u>.

- A. Any person intending to undertake construction, alteration or repair of any building or other structure upon or adjacent to any public highway may be granted a permit by the Director of Operations, of or the designee of said director, to occupy a portion of such highway and/or sidewalk for building materials, construction equipment, accessories or any other needs specifically related to construction under such terms and conditions as the City Engineer may specify with regard to building construction requirements, and the Office of Operations may specify with regard to the needs of traffic and parking.
- B. The fee for such permit shall be one hundred (\$100.), and such permit shall be valid for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days. Said permit may be renewable upon the filing of another fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).

Sidewalks:

- 1. If the construction activities set forth in Subparagraph A above cause a sidewalk, or any portion of a sidewalk to be closed or partially obstructed, as described below in paragraph 4, the fee for such permit shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) for thirteen (13) weeks plus any additional fees required in paragraphs 2 and 3 below. Upon the expiration of thirteen (13) weeks, said permit may be renewed upon the payment of another fee in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100).
- 2. The permit holder shall be obligated to pay the City an additional twenty five dollars (\$25) for each calendar day, including the initial day, of construction that a sidewalk, or any portion of a sidewalk is closed.
- 3. If the construction activities set forth in Section A cause a sidewalk to be partially obstructed but nevertheless permit public travel on the sidewalk, as in the case of sidewalk sheds or scaffolding above a sidewalk, there shall be an additional fee

of twenty five dollars (\$25), for each week that the sidewalk is partially obstructed.

C. Streets;

- 1. If the construction activities set forth in Subparagraph A above cause a City street, or any portion of a City street to be closed or partially obstructed, the fee for such permit shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) for thirteen (13) weekes plus any additional fees as required below. Upon the expiration of thirteen (13) weeks, said permit may be renewed upon the payment of another fee in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100).
- 2. For each calendar day that each lane of street, including any lane reserved for parking, is closed the daily fee shall be as follows:

Street Designation (as provided by	Permit Fee per
the Director of Operations)	lane per day
Residential	<u>\$50</u>
Collector	<u>\$100</u>
Minor Arterial	<u>\$150</u>
Major Arterial	\$200

- D. The permittee shall indicate on the application for the permit the date or dates upon which such construction activity is to take place. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Director of Operations, or his/her designee, may make reasonable accommodations to the permittee to provide flexibility regarding the scheduled date(s) of construction activity, particularly if the dates of construction activity are impacted by weather, public emergencies, or other factors beyond the control of the permittee.
- E. At the time the permit is issued, the permittee shall pay the City a fee based upon the permittee's estimate of the duration of construction activity. At the conclusion of the construction activity, the permittee shall pay any additional fees that may be due, or shall be entitled to a refund, or credit, if the fee paid at the time of issuance of the permit exceeds the amount due.
- F. Should the Stamford Police or other authorized government agent require additional sidewalk and/or street lanes to be closed, beyond those specified in the permit, in order to ensure public safety then the Director of Operations, or the designee of said director, may increase the permit fee, at a rate double the rates described above, to reflect the additional closures. However, no additional fee shall be required if the reason for the additional sidewalk and/or street lane closure was due to factors beyond the control of the permit holder.
- G. <u>The Mayor may, at any time, adjust the fees set forth herein up to the maximum amount provided as follows, The maximum adjustment of any fee shall be no more than the Consumer Price Index for Northeast Urban Consumers prepared by the</u>

United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, using July 1, 2016 as the base period. The Board of Representatives shall be informed of any such adjustment at least 60 days prior to the adjustment going into effect. This shall not restrict the Board of Representatives, at any time by ordinance, from changing any fees described herein. Nor shall it restrict the Mayor, at any time, from proposing to the Board of Representatives other changes in fees than provided herein.
