Stamford Harbor Master's Report 02/17/2015

- As of 2/14/2015, 2 mooring renewal applications for Stamford Harbor have been received and paid in full. A report on proposed new mooring standards will be made by the appropriate committee. (correction at 13:37 2/17/2015, now 4 applications received)
- In the past 14 days, we have had two 20+ foot outboard boats sink at their docks due to snow and ice. There was no pollution.
 - 1. At Harbor Point North, remained iced-in for several days. The dock master contacted the owner & eventually gained access through the ice to remov the boat from the water.
 - 2. The second was at Palmer Landing. Mike Taylor took the call and gave what help he could as I was out of town. He supplied a large capacity pump however, the boat continued taking on large amounts of water.



 We have had heavy and continual icing in the west branch. It is possible more damage will come to light later. The Vane Brothers tug *Red Hook* and another boat presently docked at Harbor Point have both been engaged in breaking ice in the west branch. The direction and/or authority to do so is unknown. CG at Boston has been contacting me (almost) daily requesting ice reports for the harbor.





 There is a great deal of floating garbage and debris in the harbor. Much appears to

be caught in various back-eddies and has been there for several weeks. With no facilities to remove it, a hazard





to small boats, safety and health may develop.

• Finally, the Harbor Master is now officially bored with snow and would request that the Commission arrange to have it all taken away.
