Cars and trucks can benefit greatly
from clean air filters. Many drivers
are aware of the need to change
the oil in their vehicles according to
the intervals designated in
their owners' manuals, but few
may be aware of the many benefits of
changing air filters. One such benefit pertains to fuel efficiency.
The automotive website CarsDirect.com notes that studies
have shown that changing clogged air filters can improve fuel
efficiency by as much as 10 percent and save drivers as much
as 15 cents per gallon of fuel. Clean air filters also can benefit
the environment. When vehicle air filters are clogged, air flow
to the engine is reduced, adversely affecting vehicle emissions.
Clean filters increase air flow to the engine, reducing vehicle
emissions as a result. Clean air filters also can help drivers get
more out of their vehicle investments. Designed to trap dirt and
debris, clean air filters prolong engine life by preventing such
particles from damaging engine components. Drivers can check
their owners' manuals for air filter replacement guidelines, but
manufacturers generally advise drivers change their air filters
every 12,000 to 15,000 miles. Such a practice is inexpensive

Longest roads in
North America

Road trips are popular all year long,
and driving the same roads during
various seasons can yield entirely
different views along the way. Many
scenic highways can take travelers
across the country, and for those
drivers interested in traveling the
longest roads in North America, there
are two options at the ready.

At 4,990 miles (8,030 kilometers),
the Trans-Canada Highway is the
longest roadway in North America. It
is a federal-provincial highway system
that travels through all 10 provinces
of Canada between the Atlantic and
Pacific Oceans. A person can travel
all the way from Newfoundland to
British Columbia on the highway. The
system was approved in 1940 and the
highway officially opened in 1962.
Drivers on the highway will easily
recognize the green and white maple
leaf route markers.

Drivers south of the Canadian
border can travel along U.S. Route
20. Spanning 3,365 miles (5,415
kilometers), Route 20 is an east-west
highway and the longest road in the
United States. In the east, Route 20
terminates in Boston, Mass. In the
west, it ends at Newport, Ore. The "20"
in the route's number indicates it is a
coast-to-coast route. Route 20 travels
through Oregon, Idaho, Montana,
Wyoming, Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois,
Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York,
and Massachusetts.

Although the length of U.S. Route
6 was shortened when California
renumbered its highways in 1964 and
a portion of the route was transferred
to another highway, the road is the
longest continuous roadway in the
United States. It is not considered a
major transcontinental route because
Route 6 does not extend to the west

APPROVING FEE SCHEDULE
FOR TERRY CONNERS ICE RINK

Notice is hereby given that at the regular monthly meeting of the 30th Board of Representatives held on Novem-
ber 4, 2020, the Board of Representatives approved Resolution No. 4067, amending the current Terry Connors
Ice Rink ice rental fee schedule to approve the following temporary Non-Resident Group Rate:

Ice Rental:

Category	Rate through 6/15/21
Non-Resident Group Rate	\$575/hour

The amendment is subject to the following conditions: 1) the Temporary Non-Resident Group Rate is effective
for non-contractual ice time; 2) the Resident Rate will not be impacted by this rate increase; 3) the Temporary
Non-Resident Group Rate will apply to all Non-Resident group ice time not scheduled as of November 15, 2020;
4) all group ice time scheduled by Resident or Non-Resident Groups that is "given back" to the rink for re-
booking, will be available to be "sold" at the Temporary Non-Resident Group Rate; and 5) in the event that Terry
Connors Rink cannot "sell" the available ice time within one week of the available time, the rink Manager may
lower the Non-Resident Group Rate to a rate not less than \$485/hour, provided, however, that the rink Manager
shall set rates in such a manner as to maximize revenues to the rink.

This amendment shall expire on June 15, 2021, unless further modified by the Board of Representatives.
