There was a statement made in the last committee meeting that we really did not want New Yorkers overrunning our neighborhoods with beach parking. The attached indicates those parking in and around the beaches are primarily Stamford residents, followed by Connecticut residents from other towns, and out of state being a distant third.

80% of the RPP violations are for in State plates and 20% for out of state plates. Overall, 59% of the RPP violations are for plates registered in Stamford.

Hi Valerie,

Attached is the beach violation comparison referred to in last night's Transportation Committee meeting for distribution.

The 3 sections top to bottom are:

- Failure to Display Permit violations
- Residential Parking Permit violations

- Total Citywide violations – note this is **not** the total beach and RPP, this is **ALL** violations Citywide (meter violations, permits, etc.)

These are also broken out for in state vs. out of state plates as well as paid vs. unpaid citations.

Left to right:

- The entire 2019 beach season 5/1/19 thru 9/30/19
- The start of beach season to mid-June for 2019
- The start of beach season to mid-June for 2020

It should be noted that the citations issued after 6/1/2020 will not escalate until 6/15/2020 so this may have an effect on both the paid citation % as well as the total amount for this time period. Also the TVO's have not been issuing Citywide Citations since March 2020 as they were reassigned out of class to the beaches to enforce social distancing at the parks/beaches so the Citywide total is significantly lower as a result for this time frame.

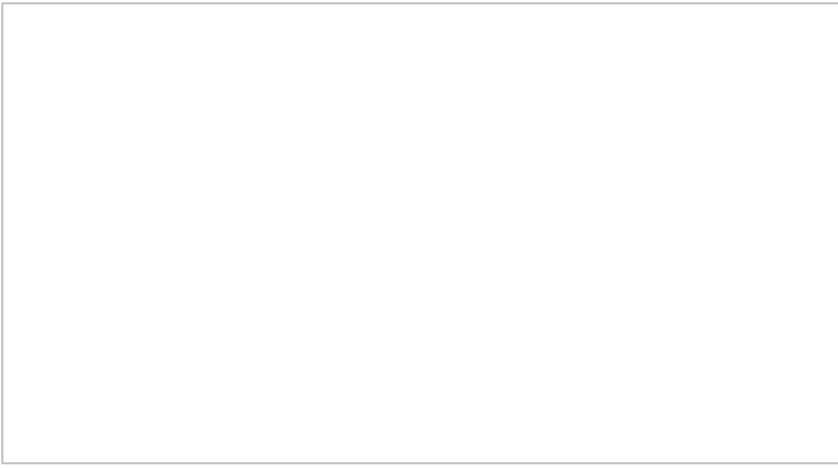

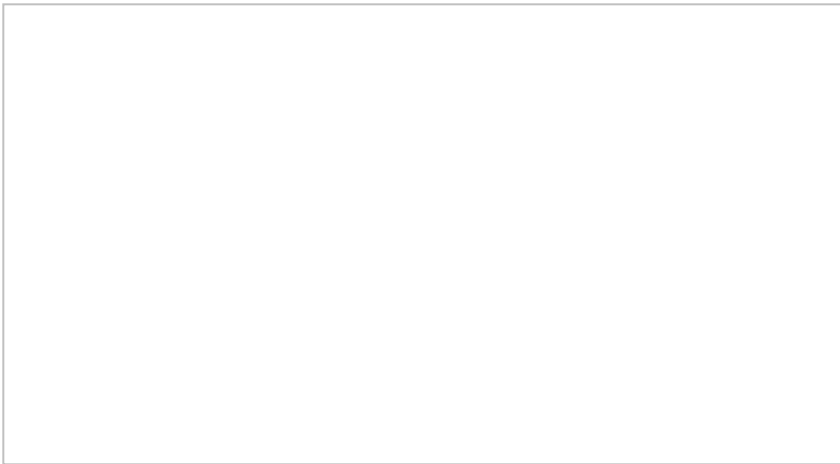
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
