## SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTAL AMENDING CHAPTER 231 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ADDING ARTICLE XIII. – AUTOMATED TRAFFIC ENFORCE-MENT SAFETY DEVICES

This proposed ordinance amends Chapter 231 of the Code of Ordinances, Vehicles and Traffic, by adding Article XIII, Automated Traffic Enforcement Safety Devices, Sections 231-82 through 231-95, to authorize the use of automated traffic enforcement devices at certain locations within the City of Stamford which locations will be identified in a future plan to be submitted to and approved by the Board of Representatives and the CT Department of Transportation. The proposed ordinance further provides that if a motor vehicle is detected by an automated traffic enforcement device to be exceeding the posted speed limit by 10 or more miles per hour the operator will be in violation of the article and the owner of the vehicle shall receive a citation and be subject to a fine of \$50 or \$75 if there are outstanding fines under this article. In addition, the proposed ordinance sets forth potential defenses to an alleged violation; a provision relating to the City's retention of personally identifiable information; and a provision prohibiting the parking of a vehicle on any public property in the City if the registered owner of the vehicle owes delinquent fines and fees from this article in a cumulative amount of \$245.00.
