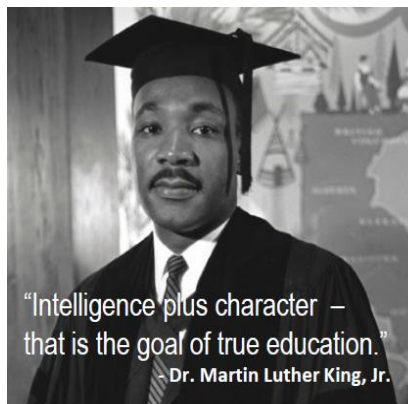

FAQs

1. What time should I arrive?
 - Please plan to arrive by 11am to allow time for set-up prior to registration that starts at 12pm
2. What should I wear?
 - The dress for the day very casual. Please wear logo gear representing your organization (i.e. Greek letters, polo shirts with logos, and T-shirts).
3. How many attendees are forecasted?
 - In 2013 attendance was over 1,000. We project a higher attendance in 2015.
4. Historically, how many organizations/companies have partnered as resource providers?
 - In 2013 we had approximately 50 organizations from the private, government and non-profit sectors.
5. As a resource provider what do I need bring and will there be tables and chairs provided?
 - We will provide the table and chairs, however, it is open selection. So first come, first position.
 - Please plan to bring materials for 750 youth and/or 300 adults
 - Please bring signage, tablecloths, banners, etc. to market your organization.
6. Who is the target market?
 - The entire community is invited to this FREE event. Lunch will be provided at no cost and students will receive a backpack.
 - The target group is the family with students of all ages in public schools or childcare.
7. How will the Expo be structured?
 - The Expo will be interactive to allow for One-On-One time with the attendees. The attendees will simply walk from table to table to engage with the resource providers.
 - One room will be provided for presentations.
8. Where should I park my vehicle?
 - Parking is available at meters on surrounding streets, Bell Street Garage and the Stamford Town Center.
9. Are volunteers needed?
 - Yes!
10. What are the desired results?
 - Increase the number of well prepared high student seniors for the college acceptance, financial aid and scholarship process.
 - Introduction of new and additional resources to families in the underserved community.

 - All organizations must register on or before February 15, 2015
 - Each resource organization is limited to one table and two chairs.
