Many of us have signed the petition, made phone calls, and written letters. We are writing this letter collectively, as the parents of the students enrolled in the Domus Knights program. We have the most to lose by your vote to deny the Memorandum of Agreement for the Domus Knights and Domus Vikings.

We cannot understand why you would vote against a program that is helping our children and does not cost the district anything. For years, our kids have struggled in school. We appreciate all that the guidance counselors, social workers, and psychologists who support our kids have done, but it was just not enough.

The services the family advocates provide are not available from regular school supports. The family advocates reach our children in ways no one else has been able to. Perhaps that is because they are role models, who look like our children, listen to our children, and love our children. They do whatever it takes to make them successful: they pick them up in the morning, they find them when they aren't in class, they provide a safe space when school gets too stressful, and they make school fun with birthday cakes and attendance challenges and field trips. They help our families when we struggle with expenses. If we need school supplies or sports equipment or help with food, they are there. We have seen a marked improvement in our children's academic engagement, attendance, behavior, and overall mental health since working with the family advocates.

You say our voices matter. You say you want Brown and Black kids to succeed. And then you cruelly remove the first in-school program that has ever delivered on that promise. And it does not cost the city a thing to continue the program. Your vote against an excellent fully funded program that helps struggling Black and Brown students find success in school speaks volumes about the value you place on our children's lives. You have communicated loud and clear that Black and Brown lives don't matter.

We ask that you please revisit the MOA and approve it immediately as our children are back in school without their family advocates during a very stressful time.
