RESOLVED that the voting hours of the election to be held in the City of Stamford on April 2, 1951 for the election of the officers as prescribed in the Stamford Charter consolidating the town and city of Stamford, Connecticut, shall be extended to include the hours between 6 A.M. and 8 P.M., E.S.T., pursuant to Chapter 10, Section 100, of the Stamford Charter, 1949, and pursuant to Section 619 of the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut, revision of 1949, and pursuant to Section 144A of the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut, Revision of 1949.

It was MOVED by John Cameron, 20th District, to adopt the resolution, seconded by Samuel Cook, 11th District, and CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.
