## JUNE 16. 1953

A Special Meeting of the Board of Representatives was held on June 16, 1953 at Burdick Junior High School at 8 P.M. pursuant to a call from Mayor Quigley. Meeting was called to order at 8:10 P.M. by President John L. Cameron.

The "Call" issued by the Mayor was read by the Clerk.

"I, Thomas F. J. Quigley, Mayor of the City of Stamford, State of Connecticut, give notice, in accordance with Sec. 202 of the Charter of the City of Stamford, that I am calling a Special Meeting of the Board of Representatives for Tuesday, June 16, 1953 at 8 P.N. at the Burdick Junior High School Auditorium, for the following purpose:

1. To act upon the request of the Registrars of Voters for an emergency appropriation of \$5,000. to cover the cost of a Referendum Election to be held on June 22nd, as ordered the State Law, House Bill #1811.

In accordance with Sec. 202 of the Charter of the City of Stamford, I am hereby ordering that a written notice of the aforesaid Special Meeting be forwarded to each member of the Board of Representatives by mail, to his residence, to be deposited in the mails at least 72 hours before the time fixed for said meeting, by a police officer of the Stamford Folice Department."

Roll call was taken by Clerk. There were 25 present, 14 absent and one resigned. The absent members were as follows: Joseph Caputo, Paul Plotkin, Michael Vitti, Robert Lewis, John Canavan, John Sandor, Joseph Zdanowicz, Vito Longo, Helen Peatt, Joseph Carlin, Helen Bromley, Karl Young, Jr., Edward Hogan and Ralph Nau. The resigned member is John Charleson.

Patrick Hogan MOVED, seconded by Stephen Kelly, that the emergency appropriation of \$5000. covering the cost of Referendum Election to be held on June 22, 1953, as ordered by House Bill #1811, adopted at the recent State General Assembly, be approved, and CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

James Mulreed MOVED that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by John Cook and CARRIED.
