(1) Concerning M.E.A. Collective Bargaining Contract covering period from July 1, 1968 through June 30, 1970.

MR. HEMINGWAY, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, said his Committee held a meeting and all members were present and recommend approval of the M.E.A. contract. He SO MOVED; seconded by Mr. Kelly, Mr. Boccuzzi, Mr. Durso, Mr. Connors, Mr. Alswanger.

MR. MORRIS said the Republican Party feels that this contract and other contracts negotiated by this Administration has been poorly managed and places a heavy burden on the taxpayers.

MR. RUSSBACH said he intends to vote against this contract for one reason and one reason only: Article II under Union Security states that all employees hired after July 1, 1968 shall become members not later that 60 days after their date of employment as a condition of their continued employment.

He said this means a "Closed Shop" and means you can't work if you don't join a Union. He said to him this is Unamerican, Undemocratic and a violation of the freedom of choice and he feels that our labor negotiator, in agreeing to this condition, arbitrarily sacrificed the rights of future City employees. He said if a man wants to work, he should not be compelled to join a Union.

THE PRESIDENT called for a VOTE on the motion to approve the M.E.A. contract. CARRIED with three no votes and one abstention (Mr. Kaplan).\*

MR. RICH said he wished to point out something that should be obvious to everyone - that this resolution is in general language so that this Board can take further and more considered action on the subject in January, or even in February, but at least we are on record with the General Assembly in Hartford that we want a Home Rule Act pertaining to this and we will supply the particulars later, He asked the President if he is correct in this.

THE PRESIDENT said this is correct. He called for a vote on the following resolution. CARRIED unanimously:
