Rep. Fountain stated that the Committee was not happy with the process. They did not like things coming to them at the last minute. The process will change and additional appropriations will start coming down next month.

Rep. Fedeli stated that this is an area in which change has not been good. They had a process which had been in place for decades where the administration would come in at the proper time for the appropriation when the appropriation took place. It worked. This is the first year the process was not followed and everything came to the Board in June in a lump sum. It is her preference and the preference of the Republican Caucus that this not happen again. This is not an effective way to communicate with the Board. This point was made to the OPM Director and Mr. Handler. She will support the appropriations tonight, but will not support future appropriations if this reoccurs.

Rep. Fountain stated that the Democratic Caucus agrees.

Rep. Ryan read the following statement:

Despite the semantic games being played by the administration that claim the contrary, the appropriations requested here tonight have already been spent, and the liabilities have already been incurred - well BEFORE this additional 2 Million dollar spending request comes before us – a clear violation of the City Charter. The Charter states that "No liability shall be incurred or expenditure made ... nor shall the city pay out any money not authorized by an appropriation" The argument that the money has not yet

been spent is itself a dubious notion, but to claim that the liability has not yet been incurred is frivolous. In fact, the administration's whole argument for the necessity of this appropriation is that we are already bound to pay it.

Yet, in an attempt to circumvent the Charter, it is further claimed that the additional spending is authorized under the Charter section on spending for emergencies, which states that: "an expenditure may be made, provided authorization has been obtained from the Chair of the BOF... for the following **emergencies**: snow removal and special election expenses, and for any situation where the public health and safety are endangered." One doesn't have to look very hard at some of this new spending to conclude that it did **not** need be spent immediately, **before** board approvals, to prevent the public health and safety from being endangered. Incidentally, neither of these two issues – when the liability was incurred, or the true nature of the so-called emergency spending - is addressed at all in the administration's just released legal opinion.

By the administration's own admission, the requests for additional spending should have been presented at the time they were needed to the fiscal oversight boards for due consideration **before** any liability was incurred. Indeed, after being rightly criticized from all quarters, the administration has promised to follow this proper procedure in the future. But is an apology and a promise to do it right next year good enough?

I'm puzzled as to how my colleagues feel about their fiscal oversight responsibility being roundly ignored. I ask you, do you enjoy volunteering your free time to pour over budget lines, getting input from constituents, arguing the merits for or against a budget item, and then finally voting on the budget --only to be arrogantly brushed aside? How did the BOF members feel about that? Well, if you had attended the relevant BOF meetings you would have witnessed their angry reproaches.

BOF Vice Chair Mary Lou Rinaldi captured the anger of the BOF well when she excoriated the administration on the unauthorized spending stating "this is the way of going in the back door and funding cuts that the BOF and the BOR made during the budget process" She further stated "why do we have a BOF if everything that we take action on is ignored?" "You didn't make the cuts at the beginning of the new administration and now you are asking us to ... fund it through the back door." BOF Chair John Louizos lamented that "the six of us [BOF members] should go home and not come back" and he further stated that "we may as well take the Charter ... and rip it up."

However, despite the outrage voiced by the BOF members at the administration's blatant lapse of fiscal management, and the administration's undermining of the legislative budgetary process, with one exception, they voted for it anyway.

<u>I refuse</u>
<u>to do that.</u>

Rep. Mahoney read the following statement:

Tonight I would like to speak in opposition to these requests for additional spending. Mayor Martin has been in office for seven months, but had previously been on the Board of Finance for two years and on the Board of Reps for many more. I think he mentioned

tonight he has been in public service here in Stamford for 31 years, most of them probably sitting right up there at the President's chair, protecting the prerogatives of the Board of Representatives. His Chief of Staff has been on the Board of Finance for eight years. His Director of Administration was retained because, according to our Mayor, he was too valuable to let go. And yet, with all this experience and knowledge we find ourselves in a position of having to approve additional funding for money authorized and/or spent in the last fiscal year after the fact, potentially in violation of the Charter. Why? Is it because the Mayor's office did not believe he needed approval? Is it because the Mayor's office was asleep as department after department overspent their respective budgets? Is that those departments did not bother to inform the Mayor? Or is it because the Mayor knew no matter what, this austere body would give him whatever he wanted. We should all ask ourselves how far we are willing to go to be complicit in this betrayal of the public trust. At this moment right here the money has been spent, the fiscal year is over, and we are being asked to cover over what could very well be a violation of our Charter. The Charter calls for approval prior to any authorization of any excess spending. I think one of the items that we're approving in an emergency fashion is somebody's car allowance. The fact that we discuss it tonight, this makes it clear that the Mayor had no such authorization; he gets the authorization presumably tonight when we vote for it. State statute places such a significant emphasis, making sure that those who spend our money abide in the rules, that it holds anyone who violates the rules personally liable for the excess and unauthorized spending. But here we sit with a dilemma, forced once again to agree quickly, before all the facts are out, just like OTB, just like the school purchase. This has been the M.O., modus operandi, of our mayor; approve what I need, approve what I want now, or you will cause harm to the City. This is a shame and it is no way to run a \$500 million city. I would urge my colleagues to be cognizant of the fact that we are all stewards of the public trust. Our job is not to be rushed by the Mayor's office in to any decision. We are duty bound to represent the best interests of our constituents. We should be wary that we are not found complicit in agreeing to a violation of the Charter, which may send a chilling message to the creditors who have loaned us over \$500 million. We have an obligation to uphold the Charter. Our constituents and our creditors need to know that the City of Stamford will follow its own rules as outlined in the Charter. These appropriations should be voted down: the Mayor should specifically identify the City officials that approved these excess expenses and they should be held to account. So Mr. President, I thank you for your time and I urge my colleagues to think about this and to think about this in the context of the future and to send the Mayor a message that he has to abide in the protocol and deference to the other elected boards in the City and he has to come back for at least dialogue and approval for anything in excess of the budget that we and the Board of Finance approved for him. Thank you, Mr. President.

Rep. McMullen stated that this he is concerned that this is the third month in a row when the Board is being asked to approve an item that is somewhat at the last minute. This appears to be a pattern of the Board getting requests beyond the point where it is possible to make a reasoned decision and for this reason he will be voting against these appropriations.
