**WHEREAS**, Ron Malloy was elected to the position of Registrar in November 2012 and was sworn in at the Opening of the Connecticut State Session in January 2013; and

**WHEREAS,** Ron Malloy had been an absentee ballot Head Moderator for many years prior to his election to the position of Registrar; and

**WHEREAS**, Ron Malloy became involved with the Young Democrats as soon as he returned to Stamford after college; and

**WHEREAS**, Ron Malloy was on the Parks Commission for over 5 years, involved in the changes from Dyke Park to the creation of Kosciusko Park and the park behind the Old Town Hall; and

**WHEREAS**, during Ron's terms as Registrar, Stamford has grown to have the largest number of voters in Connecticut (78,500); and

**WHEREAS,** Stamford has won in "the large city category" of the Democracy Cup eight times since its inception in 2008, which is given and presented by the Secretary of the State for the largest voter turnout; and

**WHEREAS**, Ron Malloy and his counterpart Lucy Corelli have been a great team. They have both worked very hard in implementing all changes in the voting laws of Connecticut and training of the new voter equipment that was required. This meant working with not only the seasonal workers in the Registrar of Voters office but much time spent training and teaching the hundreds of poll workers as well.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the 31<sup>st</sup> Board of Representatives congratulates Ron Malloy for his efforts on working with the new voting regulations and thanks him for his years of service to the larger Stamford community.
