Dear Mr. Handler:

I attach with this letter the approved DSSD budget for the tax year 2014/2015 which reflects \$1,959,510.00 of Special Assessment income.

The final DSSD Grand List of October 2013 supplied by Greg Stackpole on March 26, 2014 and adjusted via e-mail on May 1, 2014 totals \$1,374,108,897 Net Taxable Assessed Value. After adding Net Taxable Assessed Value of \$88,212,010 for UBS buildings that are billed directly by the DSSD as per contract, the adjusted DSSD Net Taxable Grand List totals \$1,462,320,907.

Therefore, the DSSD special assessment levy should be set at 1.34 mills to achieve the assessment income of \$1,959,510.00.

Please use the 1.34 mill rate for the July 2014 and January 2015 DSSD tax bills.
