NOTICE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS AVAILABLE FOR SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAMS

The City of Stamford is making available requests for proposals to licensed/accredited center-based day care providers or those center-based providers which are demonstrably in the process of receiving an acceptable form of licensure and accreditation to care for children aged three and four in the City of Stamford through the School Readiness Program for the period July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. This request for proposals is being made such that if funds are made available by the Connecticut Legislature to provide half day, extended day, school day or full day care slots as the State has defined them, the City will have available a list of providers with whom it can subcontract to provide care to enrolled children under the State's guidelines for the School Readiness Program. All center-based providers must submit an RFP for the City to submit to the State Department of Education for final approval prior to the start of the center's program. Center-based program providers include for profit or not for profit private preschool programs, public preschool programs, Head Start programs, and state funded day care programs. Family day care providers are not eligible to participate in the School Readiness Program at this time.

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PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 218 (SWIMMING POOLS)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF STAMFORD THAT:

Chapter 218 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Stamford is hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 218. SWIMMING POOLS

Sec. 218-1. Safety devices required.

A. Every person owning land on which there is situated a swimming pool which contains twenty-four (24) inches or more of water in depth at any point shall erect and maintain thereon an adequate enclosure surrounding the property or pool to make such body of water inaccessible to small children. Such enclosure, including gates thereon, must be not less than four (4) feet above the underlying ground; all gates must be self-latching, with latches placed four (4) feet above the grade otherwise made inaccessible from the outside to small children. [I shall satisfy the barrier requirements of the Connecticut State Building Code, as it may be amended from time to time.]

B. [A natural barrier, hedge, pool cover or other protective devices approved by the governing body may be used so long as the degree of protection afforded by the substituted devices or structures is not less than the protection afforded by the enclosure, gate and latch described herein. Every person owning land on which there is situated a swimming pool which contains twenty-four (24) inches or more of water in depth at any point shall install and maintain any and all that may be required by the barrier requirements of the Connecticut State Building Code, as it may be amended from time to time.]

Sec. 218-2. Applicable state provisions.

The term "swimming pool" as used in this chapter shall have the same meaning as that used in the State Building Code, except that it shall include swimming pools constructed prior to the date of adoption of [Section 429.1 of] the State Building Code.

There shall be a thirty-day grace period to allow for corrections of any violations that occur during the first six (6) months after adoption.

Sec. 218-4. Violations.

Any person in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter shall be fined \$200. Each day a violation of this chapter continues shall constitute a separate violation.

Sec. 218-5. Enforcement.

In addition to other available methods of enforcement, this chapter may be enforced through the civil citation process.
