**PROPOSED ORDINANCE
CONCERNING RESIDENCY POINTS FOR THE 2008-2009
ENTRY LEVEL POLICE EXAMINATIONS**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF STAMFORD THAT:

1. Five (5) bonus points shall be added to the final earned score of Stamford residents who pass the Police examination to be administered in the years 2008-2009.
2. In order to be eligible for the award of bonus points, a candidate must submit irrefutable evidence to prove that he or she has been domiciled in Stamford for at least twelve (12) months prior to the date of receipt of application for the Police examination. Further, the candidate will be required to sign a sworn affidavit attesting to the fact that he/she has been domiciled in the City of Stamford prior to the date of submission of the application. Said proof must be provided to the City's Human Resources Division at the time of application.
3. For purposes of this ordinance, "domiciled" is defined to be "that place where an individual has his/her true, fixed and permanent home, where he or she normally eats and sleeps and maintains his or her normal personal and household effects."
4. As administrator of the Police examination, the Director of Human Resources, will develop, promulgate and enforce the procedural methods and requirements for the application and awarding of residency points, including any appropriate penalties for the submission of false information. The decision of the Director of Human Resources in all related matters shall be final.
5. This ordinance pertains only to the examinations for the entry-level position of Police Officer that will be administered in the Years 2008 and 2009.
6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its enactment.
