

**SENSE OF THE BOARD RESOLUTION
RECOGNIZING LUKE BUTTENWIESER FOR HIS WORK
AS A VOLUNTEER AND INTERN WITH THE CITY OF STAMFORD
TRANSPORTATION, TRAFFIC, AND PARKING DEPARTMENT**

WHEREAS, Luke Buttenwieser first volunteered with the Transportation, Traffic and Parking Department as a junior at King School in Stamford and then became an intern in his senior year, providing direct and comprehensive assistance to Traffic Engineer Garrett Bolella; and

WHEREAS, Luke Buttenwieser will be leaving the Transportation, Traffic and Parking Department on August 9, 2019, to study at New York University; and

WHEREAS, Luke Buttenwieser has been an active participant in numerous activities at the Transportation, Traffic and Parking Department for the past two years: implementing a design manual for street signs; measuring road width and geometry; establishing proper lane markings; replying to FixItStamford issues identified by residents; providing office support to the department; managing two interns from the Mayor's Youth Employment Program to provide details for a future grant opportunity to build sidewalks within one mile of schools; writing and submitting a grant to improve the area around Columbus Park; assisting in many roadway improvement projects; developing a map that is currently being used on the TT&P website that lists all of the local and State projects in Stamford; ensuring department compliance to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for the Signs and Lines division; and participating in all project meetings for all road construction projects either underway or planned; and

WHEREAS, Luke Buttenwieser has also provided assistance directly to the Board of Representatives: attending many Transportation Committee meetings; presenting an annual update to the Transportation Committee on behalf of the department on status of the 120 hour parking violation ordinance; and researching questions and providing written responses to Committee members; and

WHEREAS, Luke Buttenwieser worked many nights and weekends to directly engage with and assist residents: helping to implement several road safety and transportation mobility initiatives including: writing and designing several flyers to promote the rules of the road as it pertains to cyclists and bike lanes; providing research and analysis on traffic accidents; and delivering flyers to every household to announce a public meeting for a road improvement project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the 30th Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford that it thanks Luke Buttenwieser for his service to the City of Stamford, wishes him well upon entering college, and recognizes that he was a valuable member of the Transportation, Traffic, and Parking Department.
