I am planning to introduce some amendments to this proposed resolution when the Sense of the Board Resolution regarding statewide window safety regulations is called at this month's Legislative & Rules Committee meeting. I would appreciate if you could send out to the full Legislative And Rules Committee in advance of the discussion so they have a chance to review it.

I will also reach out to those who cosponsored it and give them a heads up in case they want to withdraw their name from the resolution based on the potential revisions.

Motion to Amend by Substitution of Language:

- **Amendment to the Fifth WHEREAS Clause:** Strike "*...while remaining easily detachable by adults to ensure fire egress in an emergency; and*" and replace with:
"...while recognizing that such devices must be carefully evaluated by local fire and public safety officials to ensure they do not impede emergency firefighting operations or occupant egress during a fire; and"
- **Amendment to the Sixth WHEREAS Clause:** Strike "*...requiring uniform, statewide legislative action by the Connecticut General Assembly to ensure all children are equally protected regardless of their zip code or the age of their building.*" and replace with:
"...and the Connecticut General Assembly should provide municipalities with the local autonomy and legal authority to enact tailored window safety measures that align with local public safety infrastructure."
- **Amendment to the First NOW, THEREFORE Clause:** Strike "*...to introduce and pass comprehensive statewide legislation requiring the installation of temporary or removable window guards or window stops in all residential rental units where a child under the age of ten (10) resides or frequently visits.*" and replace with:
*"...to introduce and pass comprehensive **enabling legislation** that grants Connecticut municipalities **the local option to adopt***

ordinances requiring the installation of temporary or removable window guards or window stops, thereby allowing local public safety, fire, and health experts to determine the appropriate regulations and exceptions for their specific communities."
